MBSC Grant Program

- This grant program explicitly seeks to fund organizations engaged in organizing, power-building, policy, and advocacy efforts that address educational equity, arts education access and funding, community safety, or criminal justice reform.
- We encourage organizations to seek funding who are working to address them through an intersectional approach or in conjunction with other community-identified goals.
- Organizations that directly engage youth, parents, returning citizens, and justice-informed individuals and leaders are encouraged to apply.
- We also seek organizations connected to other community groups collaborating for systemic change. Additional priority will be given to groups working on intersectional, intergenerational, and racial solidarity efforts.
- Grant is capped at \$50,000 and is renewable for three years.



MBSC Grant Program

Eligible Applicants

- ➤ We fund registered 501(c)(3) organizations in good standing or groups fiscally sponsored by a registered 501(c)(3) organization.
- We fund organizations serving Chicago, Boston, and Boston's gateway cities.



MBSC Program Goals

- Community-driven and asset-based engagement, solution development, and problem-solving.
- Power building through healing practices, training, base, and community building activities, including civic and leadership development opportunities.
- In-depth political, issue, and systems analysis to address the direct issues and underlying historical, racial, and systemic inequities.
- Collective action, including public accountability and civic engagement.




MBSC Program Goals

- Unify and collaborate through coalitions, partnerships, and strategic alliances within and across issue areas and sectors.
- Expanding beyond traditional movement-building approaches, including social media, the arts, narrative change work, and alternative system development and planning.
- Measuring progress and implications for impact at the individual, community, cultural, and systems levels with opportunities for routine reflection, redirection, and adaptation as needed to meet the evolving community and political landscape.
